

## 15 Gay Friendly & Gay Hotels in Los Angeles

The Garland calls itself an "urban oasis" and we can see why – the hotel is built within 7 lush acres yet is still just a short drive from some iconic landmarks and attractions such as the Hollywood Sign, and Universal Studios.

One of our favorite features of the hotel has to be the large outdoor pool, the perfect place to cool off when the Californian sun got a little too much.

The Garland also has an onsite restaurant – The Front Yard – a casual and relaxed dining venue with a menu designed to showcase LAs diverse food culture.
